Kathleen Jones Greene of Sioux City, Iowa passed away peacefully on Friday, April 12, 2024. A Celebration of Kathleen's life will be held at Mayflower Congregational Church, 1407 West 18th Street, Sioux City, Iowa on Friday, May 3, 2024 at 11:00 A.M.

Kathleen Jones Greene was born May 31, 1928 in Burke, SD to Art and Freda Jones. At four years of age, she moved to Dupree, SD, where she completed her education graduating from high school in 1946. She

attended Yankton College in Yankton, SD. Upon completing a two-year certificate, she came to Sioux City to teach. While completing her teaching obligations, she finished her college degree at Morningside College, earning a Bachelor's Degree in 1955. She went on to teach for thirty years before retiring in 1991.

She married Clarence Scott Greene in 1951. Their marriage lasted for sixty-three years until Clarence's death. To that union there were born four children Brad, an infant son, Julie and Alan. During their marriage, she loved travel, games, puzzles, reading, needlepoint, spending time with her kids and grandkids, and playing golf.

Kathleen was active in church activities: teaching Sunday school, teaching Bible School, and substituting as organist.

She was a member of Sun Valley Golf Clubs on Monday and Thursday. She was also a member of Couples Club at Hidden Acres with her husband. She belonged to FA TTT. She was a longtime member of the Siouxland Y and the Four Seasons Club, while actively pursuing a program of exercise.

Kathleen is preceded in death by her husband Clarence, her daughter Julie, an infant son, her brothers Leland and Larry and her parents.

She is survived by sons, Bradley of Sioux City and Alan (Catherine) of Freeport, IL; three grandchildren, Caitlin (Cody) Burns, Conor (Torey) Greene, and Ashling Greene; and great-grandchild, Caylee.

The commercial refrigerator in the kitchen in the lower level has burned out. The refrigerator was more than 20 years old. We feed an average of 432 people each month at our Mayflower Food Giveaways. Last month we fed nearly 500, so we know people need our support more than ever. We had a recent setback when one of our 2 refrigerators quit working. It was over 25 years old! Vicki faithfully checks the temperatures in our refrigerators and freezers each week, and discovered the problem. We are working with our friends at Ace Refrigeration, and hope to purchase 2 refrigerators for our basement kitchen very soon. Stay tuned for more information.

We have stopped putting out coats on the coat tree, but will resume again in October. We are still working with contractors on the repair of the back door.

Also, we are asking all members and friends of Mayflower to double check the back door when leaving if they have used that door, It has left unlocked on several occasions.. We're asking all people who use the building to just double check and lock the door,.

One Hundred Year Old Building

Did you know that in 2024 the Mayflower Congregational United Church of Christ building will be 100 years old? Our beautiful building was built in 1923-24 when the quickly expanding membership outgrew the second Mayflower building at 14th and Myrtle Street. The new building cost about \$85,000. The first service was held on June 22 of 1924. The congregation assembled at the old church and the procession walked to the new church at 18th and Rebecca Street. The picture of that first day is hanging in the West Parlor.

We have started to put together some ideas on how we can celebrate this significant milestone in the best way! We are always open for suggestions. You may contact Mary Groen, or Linda Cron with some ideas, and you are also welcome to come and help us go through a LOT of historical documents and other treasures we've been discovering.
